

### Montessori

- Educational method developed over 100 years ago by Doctor Maria Montessori
- Teaches children to become problem solvers and critical thinkers through experiencing freedom within responsibility
- Focuses on the development of the whole child



Regular education is based on assumption of linear development (arrows represent increasing pressure).

Infancy



- 4 stages of development named Planes of Development
- Approximately 6 years each
- Own special characteristics
- Need for independence is expressed differently in each plane



# Characteristics of the Elementary Child The Second Plane: Ages 6–12 "Conscious Imagination"

- → Abstraction and imagination
- → Morality and justice
- → Culture
- → Peer/social interactions



## Fun Characteristics of 9-year-olds

- Are energetic
- Are daring
  - Are interested in clubs, teams, groups
- Ask "Why?"
  - Like to work and with with members of their own sex
- Daydream
- Have a strong sense of humor
- Giggle and make noise
- Want pets
- Have a collection of "things"
- Have rapidly changing interests



## Annoying/Normal Behaviors of 9-year-olds

- May now seem to resent her parents' presence
- Wants more freedom
- Wants much social activity
- Has mood swings
- Worries and complains
- Is so busy with her own activity that she seems unaware of others
- Wants fairness
- Bathing can be a problem
- Lays much blame and emphasis on who started what



## Fun Characteristics of 10-year-olds

- Tend to be obedient
- Have a wide variety of interests
- Readily identify with TV/Movie/Book characters
  - Are developing increasing independence
- Form good personal relationships with adults
- Are good problem solvers
- Are good listeners
- Are talkative and like to explain things
- Are voracious readers
  - Have increased ability to think abstractly
- Like rules and logic
- Are proud of their academic achievements



Annoying/Normal Behaviors of 10-year-olds

• Are moody and sensitive

Arque; talk before thinking

Tend to have messier handwriting Anger is often violent, but forgive quickly

Plots revenge

Has difficulty taking a joke on himself

Asks personal questions

May express concern if he isn't development physically like others (girls will change posture & clothing with breast development)

### Fun Characteristics of 11-year-olds

- Have high energy and can be wiggly if they sit for long periods
- Are developing their adult personalities
- Are self-aware and insightful
- Can initiate their own activity
- Prefers peers to adults
- More tolerant than the previous year
- Can set realistic, short-term.
  goals

- Can see both sides of an argument; like to debate
- Enjoys higher intellectual humor including word play and double meanings
- Have advanced research and study skills abilities
- May show aptitude toward a particular skill or subject area
- Are interested in pop culture, materialism, current events, social justice

### Annoying/Normal Behaviors of 11-year-olds

- Makes no effort to cooperate
- Is quick to criticize
- Expects perfection from others
- Challenges rules and expectations
- Loves to argue
- · May hit, kick, or slam doors
- Yells, swears, talks back, says mean and sarcastic things
- Likes to gossip
- Has intense need to be right
   or to know it all

- Makes references to your "old age"
- Needs sleep
- Has difficulty with siblings close in age
- Wants music while doing school work
- Glued to messaging
- May cheat
- May steal with peers
- · Has mood swings



So, what can we do?



Acknowledge you may parent the way you were parented and cycles are perpetuated. Lean on one another. It truly does take a village.



## Be an Authoritative Parent

#### **The 4 Parenting Styles**

#### **Permissive**

Child-driven

RESPONSIVENESS

- Rarely gives or enforces rules
- Overindulges child to avoid conflict

#### **Authoritative**

- Solves problems together with child
- Sets clear rules and expectations
- Open communication and natural consequences

#### Neglectful

- Uninvolved or absent
- Provides little nurturance or guidance
- Indifferent to child's social-emotional and behavioral needs

#### **Authoritarian**

- Parent-driven
- Sets strict rules and punishment
- One-way communication, with little consideration of child's socialemotional and behavioral needs





### Communication

• The only person you can control is you.

Calm yourself before responding.

Use other adults as a sounding board or for venting frustrations.

Be flexible rather than rigid.

Don't give up.



- Give them your attention
- Watch your first response
- Keep your opinions to yourself
  - Listen with the intent to understand
  - Don't solve it
  - Offer empathy
  - Brainstorm together
- Don't force eye contact
